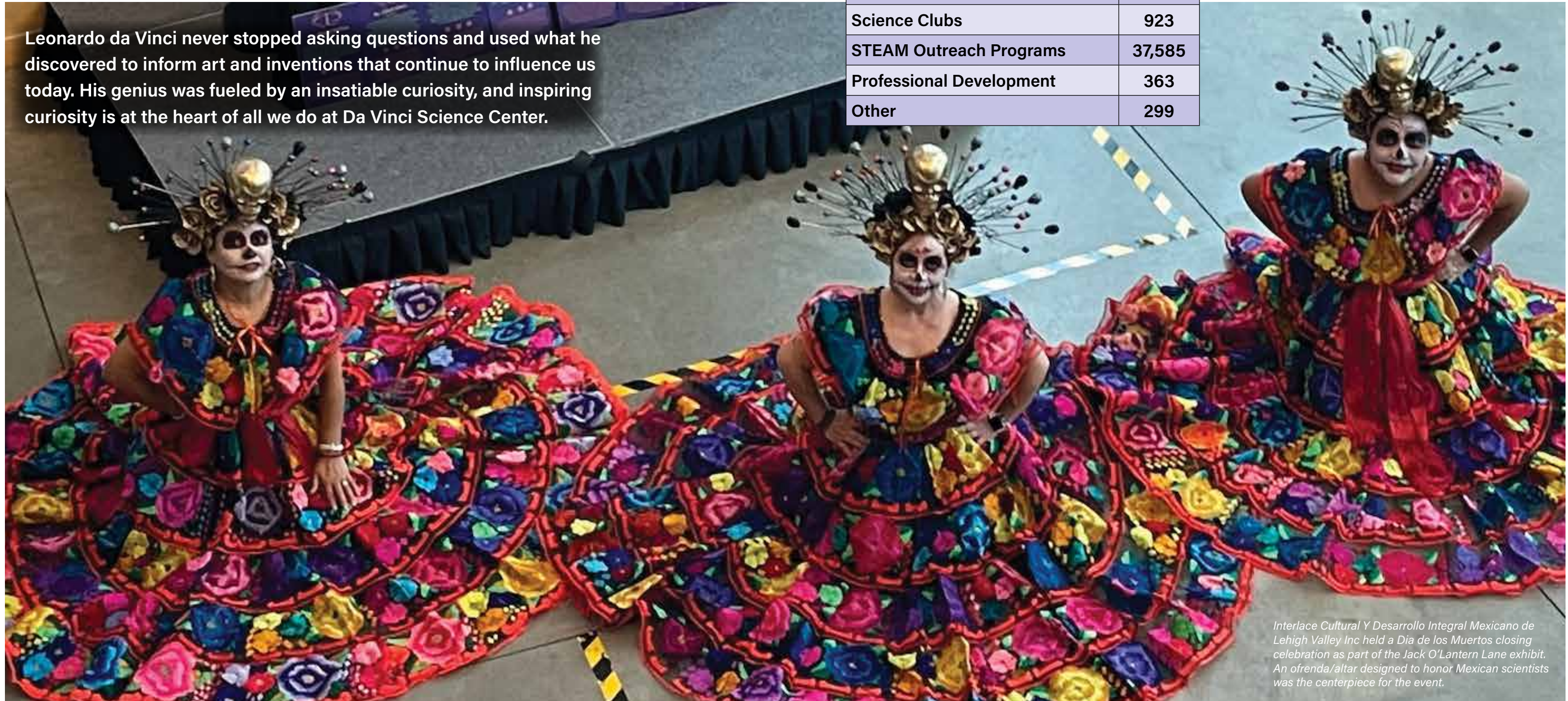

- Through the **Next Century Allentown STEM Elementary Initiative**, Science Center educators provided training for Allentown School District 4th and 5th grade teachers on the Smithsonian Science for the Classroom Curriculum, which is based on Next Generation Science Standards. Support was provided by the Lehigh Valley Community Foundation and PPL.

- The 2022 **summer camp season** set new attendance and revenue records! Young discoverers were eager to explore and make connections that deepened their understanding of the world around them. These scientists-in-training built robots, observed wildlife, mixed tasty treats and discovered the mysteries of water.

- Playing with Light was the featured **summer exhibit** at Da Vinci Science Center. Guests discovered – or rediscovered – how light plays a vital role in our daily lives through play, experimentation, and of course, creativity.

- Renowned **educator, artist and lighting designer, Professor Lyn Godley**, explored light, imagery and the impact on our health during a professional development workshop and lecture that coincided with the Playing with Light exhibit. Godley’s visit was made possible through a Professional Development for Arts Educators grant from the US Dept of Education.

- **Jack-O-Lantern Lane** featured a not-so-spooky Candy Lane, a fun scavenger hunt and a Día de los Muertos display honoring Mexican scientists. The display was created in collaboration with the Interlace Cultural Y Desarrollo Integral Mexicano de Lehigh Valley Inc/ Cultural Interlace and Integral Mexican Development of Lehigh Valley (LCDI). This enchanting exhibit exemplified the integration of the Arts and STEM while spotlighting a unique cultural tradition.

Da Vinci Science Center is dedicated to fostering an inclusive culture where every person sees themselves as a scientist. This begins with role models who spark interest in STEAM studies and careers.



## CELEBRATING CULTURAL DIVERSITY

The Science Center hosted its first bilingual event, Science Under the Stars, during Hispanic Heritage Month. A celestial success, the event welcomed more than 600 visitors and members of the Lehigh Valley Amateur Astronomical Society eager to explore the skies. Exhibits and shows were presented in English and Spanish by bilingual staff and volunteers.

The STEAM for All Spanish Language Initiative establishes the Science Center as a place where Spanish-speakers feel welcome while removing language barriers. Efforts to date include informational and exhibit signage, marketing materials, bilingual events, and classes taught in Spanish.

## PRIDE IN STEAM

The Science Center celebrated PRIDE Month with a Pride in STEAM event highlighting LGBTQ+ people who have made important contributions in STEAM. The Bradbury-Sullivan LGBT Community Center provided information on their programs and services.

The Da Vinci Science Center is committed to continuing its journey to center equity. Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, Accessibility and Belonging (DEIAB) is a key focus area in its Strategic Plan. Its overall goal is to create a culture of inclusion where everyone feels welcome and safe to fully participate in STEAM. Recent efforts include the development of a DEIAB Action Plan to build a culture of belonging and professional learning sessions for trustees and staff focused on centering equity.







# WISE

The Science Center's WISE Initiative brings together girls with a passion for STEAM with women who have turned their passion into careers.

WISE is dedicated to encouraging girls who aspire to follow a STEAM career path and creating a supportive community of women employed in STEAM fields. Women make up only about 28% of the STEM workforce, yet these fields offer some of the fastest growing, and highest paying, jobs of the future. A special thanks to Evonik Corporation for making a very generous gift to support the initiative. Evonik's leadership gift is providing opportunities for more girls to engage in STEAM education and supporting the growth of its mentorship program.

# CREATING COMMUNITY CONNECTIONS



The doors may not open on the new Da Vinci Science Center at PPL Pavilion until spring 2024, but in addition to constructing the new facility, we are busy building relationships with the local community with the goal to be integrated into the fabric of downtown Allentown, Pa.

## EDUCATIONAL OUTREACH

Da Vinci Science Center educators conducted numerous focus groups to identify priority community needs to shape the future development of Science Center programs. The Science Center's STEAM Education Advisory Committee incorporated these recommendations into a Vision Statement and Strategic Priorities for the new Da Vinci STEAM Learning Center presented to the Board of Trustees in February 2022.

## MURAL ADJACENT TO NEW SITE

Sponsored by a grant through Allentown's CORE Neighborhood Partnership Program and the Lehigh Valley Arts & Cultural Alliance, this mural pays homage to Leonardo Da Vinci and contributes to the city's vibrant public art scene, while building community excitement about new downtown facility. The artist, Matt Halm, is an Allentown native dedicated to building community through art. Many local residents took part in painting portions of the mural during a community arts participation day.

## PBS LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES AT THE CONSTRUCTION SITE

The interactive banner display decorating the construction site is one example of the Science Center's long-time partnership with PBS39 to engage young learners in STEAM.

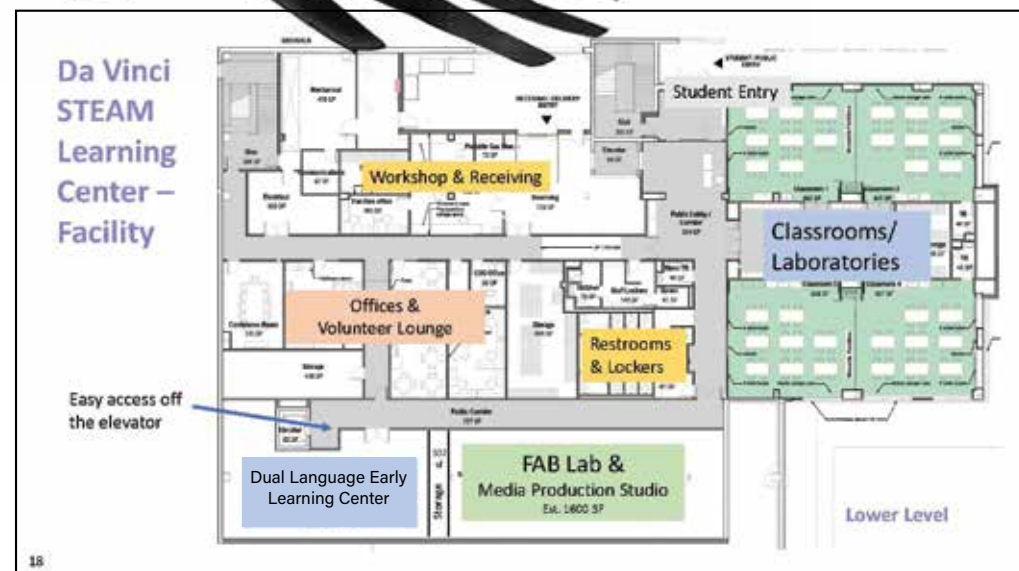

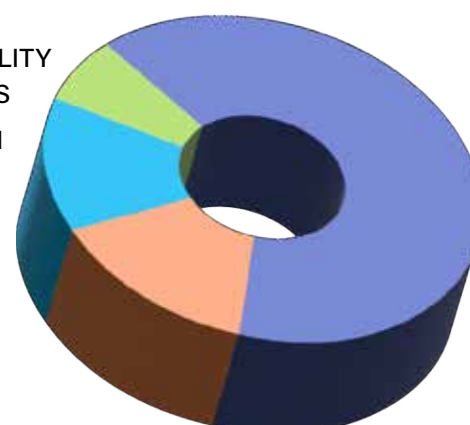

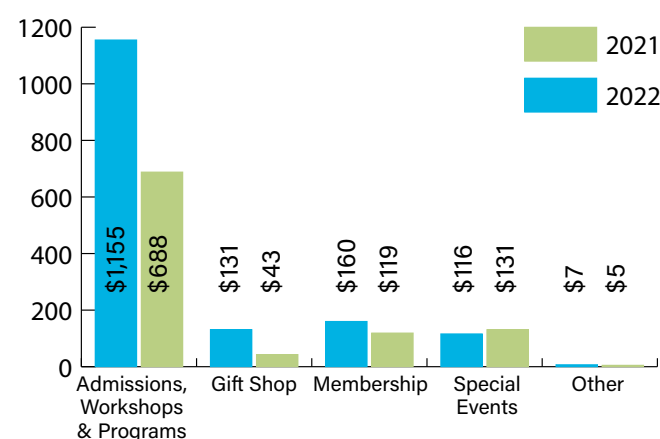

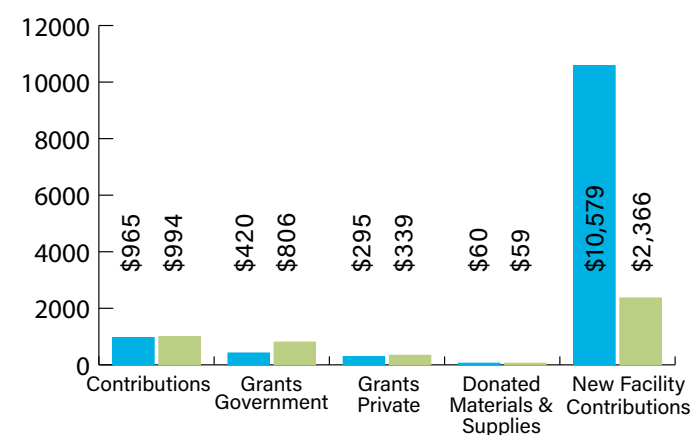
